In years past in the City of Bunnell, I can recall no homeless problem. My Grandmother helped many families add an extra room to a dwelling so there would be room for an addition to the family. She would solicit donations to purchase lumber and other materials, as well as labor to assist in the construction.

I don't recall anyone ever claiming to go without food for their families. Locally grown vegetables were plentiful, as well as locally grown pork. There were those that sold pork locally as well. I do remember one local rancher, as I was told, was headed back home when he calculated he shorted himself a nickel on a sale. He turned around, went back to town a collected his nickel.

I don't remember many people trespassing on privately owned property. My brother, and I caught people trespassing on our Father's property. A few times we called the law to have them hauled away, especially if they were armed. We had to call from a land line as there were no cell phones. Generally speaking, no one arrested ever came back.

As I understand, that has change somewhat relative to the homeless folks. I have been told, but not verified, that if a homeless person sets up a campsite on private property, the new idea is that he/she can't be removed from that property. I suppose that didn't apply to the folks behind the library in Palm Coast.

But, laughingly, the people in Bunnell have been headlined as being MEAN! What a laugher. But, folks from other municipalities want to invade Bunnell with their generosity to make Bunnell the homeless headquarters for Flagler County, with help of folks mostly from other municipalities. Whatever I can do, to help that not to happen, I will.

Church organizations need to follow the lawful ordinances of Bunnell, as do other entities and business in Bunnell must. If these organizations are unwilling to follow the law, they need to move on!

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
